Vet's Corner ...

Pet Bereavement:

Following the heartbreaking news of the death of Booker earlier this month, it seemed like an opportune time to discuss this very sensitive subject.

Booker was far too young to die, and we do not yet know the exact cause of his death.

What we **do** know is that sharing the most intimate details surrounding Booker's death has got us all talking and thinking. Writing about the events of the past 10 days must have taken **HUGE** courage on the part of Greg & Nicolai. We know that they are in the most awful pain right now, but we thank them for taking the time to share their innermost feelings at this sad time.

Through Greg & Nicolai's posts since 12th September I, personally, have felt a great affinity with two people whom I have never met.

The death of a pet is something that we do not like to talk, or think, about. Indeed death, in general, is something of a taboo subject - it shouldn't be, it is part of life.

Whether your pet dies of natural causes, or you have to make the painful decision to have him/her put to sleep, it is a very emotional time for you, your family, and other pets.

The death of a beloved pet to which you are emotionally bonded is an intense loss, comparable with the death of a human loved one - or even greater in some cases. Your pet has given you unconditional love and companionship throughout his/her life - however long, or short, that life may have been.

According to Pet Plan, 35% of people admitted to taking time off work to either settle new pets into the home, or to care for a sick pet and, according to Direct Line, 1 in 4 pet owners said they had been too upset to go into the workplace when their four legged friend died.

Pet Crematoria are on the increase - many people want to give their pet a dignified send-off. Two I have had contact with are Paws R.I.P. in Fife, and Elysian Fields in Ayr.

For many people, making an album of photos and memories can be a great comfort - I did this when we lost our beloved house rabbit in 2003. I filled it with poems, cards that people had sent us, photos of Bobby, our memories and his cremation certificate. We still have Bobby's ashes.

Some people are embarrassed to show their grief over the loss of a pet and, all too often, non-pet lovers are heard to say "it was only a dog / rabbit / cat / whatever". How insensitive - your pet is a member of your family, and it is entirely natural to grieve for him/her when he/she dies.



Just this side of heaven is a place called Rainbow Bridge.

When an animal dies that has been especially close to someone here, that pet goes to Rainbow Bridge. There are meadows and hills for all of our special friends so that they can run and play together. There is plenty of food, water and sunshine, and our friends are warm and comfortable.

All the animals who had been ill and old are restored to health and vigor; those who were hurt or maimed are made whole and strong again, just as we remember them in our dreams of days and times gone by. The animals are happy and content, except for one small thing; they each miss someone very special to them, who had to be left behind.

They all run and play together, but the day comes when one suddenly stops and looks into the distance. His bright eyes are intent; His eager body quivers. Suddenly he begins to run from the group, flying over the green grass, his legs carrying him faster and faster.

You have been spotted, and when you and your special friend finally meet, you cling together in joyous reunion, never to be parted again. The happy kisses rain upon your face; your hands again caress the beloved head, and you look once more into the trusting eyes of your pet, so long gone from your life but never absent from your heart.






From cuddles, new coats, new toys, new places to explore, to being part of a loving family, Booker & Tula were happy and content. Never were they happier, than when the four of them were together.

Please note that these coats are purchased at no cost to the kennels, but every penny of the sale price, £16.50, goes towards the upkeep of our kennels, and the welfare of all the dogs in our care.
