<u>Getting there</u>:

On the day, car parking will be available and we ask that people follow the signs to the car park and park considerately. When you turn into Caldwells farm which is not actually in Collessie village it's on the main A91 just before or after the Collessie turn off – depending on which direction you are coming from! Look out for the show signs at the entrance. Once you turn into the farm there is a long drive way which eventually takes you up to the show arena with the show taking place **indoors**. Across from the arena there is a large field which we have the use of during the day, allowing people to give their dogs a "wee" walk. Sometimes it is always a good idea to maybe walk your dogs in the field prior to entering the show to do their "business" especially if you have come a long way.

Tickets:

Cost of advanced tickets this year is once again held at last year's price of $\pounds 3.50$ for adult's - kids under 16 free - these can be purchased at our kennels or dog walks in the run up to the show. While we will not have the advanced show ticket raffle this year a free goody bag will be given at the front door on entry (1 per ticket).

Please note that on the day door price will be $\pounds 4$. Everybody who enters the show will receive a wristband, which must be <u>worn at all times</u> during the show. This will let you go in and out of the show all day – just show your wristband on entry. Otherwise you will be asked again for payment!

Once inside the arena we have a variety of stalls and refreshments available as well as our popular tombola and home baking. Also look out for official programme sellers who will be selling our show programme (cost 50p). During the day we will also be selling raffle tickets, which we encourage people to purchase as we have some excellent prizes - this will be drawn just before our grand final. So if you are not going to stay until then, please put contact details on the back of your raffle tickets. We would certainly hope that as many people as possible would stay to the end to cheer on, and support, our finalists. We would also ask that you spend some time going round the various stalls, particularly the commercial companies who help sponsor our event. Speak to them find out what they offer and who knows they may be able to help you with something. If companies feel that they have had a good response then they will be more likely to support our future shows etc.

Classes:

Before each class begins there will be an announcement that registration for the next class is now open. At the registration desk we will take your name, and dog's name, and give you a number which must be worn prominently as this is what will be used by the judge to identify you. The cost to enter each class is £1 per dog (e.g. best family 2 dogs = £2, 3 dogs = £3 etc). Once you and your dog are registered, you will join the queue waiting to be invited into the ring by the judge. All you then need to do is walk round the ring with your dog. Once the judge has made her decision she will summon everybody into the centre of the ring and announce, as in all good shows, the prize winners in reverse order. We are giving prizes to the first 6 in all classes (more than any other dog show!). If you are lucky enough to be one of our prize winners, we will ask you to stay in the ring to get some photographs taken with your prizes. The details of the class winner will then be noted, and they will have some extra individual photographs and will also go through to our grand final.

For those of you who didn't see it, or for those of you who saw it and are, perhaps, thinking about it, here it is again ...

"If you look at our 'Please Choose Me' section, you will see a lovely little character called Jock. He is eight years old, and a very gentle character. He lived in a house, and is house trained. For genuine, personal, reasons his owner, who was very upset, had to give him up.

This week he went to have an abscess removed, and it turned out to be cancerous. Fibro sarcoma cancer, in fact - an extremely nasty one. His prognosis is not good. We are completely devastated. He is going in on Wednesday (3rd April) for another operation to remove as much malignancy as possible, so we shall see what happens then.

We will keep the wee soul in the kennels, and give him the best life for as long as possible. We are looking to see if any kind soul would foster the little man, so that he'd have a happy home life. GRF would, of course, pay all necessary medical bills, etc. If anyone is kindly interested, could you please contact us privately on this matter."

THIS MONTH WE ARE TALKING TO KAREN WHO LIVES IN PERTH WITH HER GREYHOUND, FINN ...

1) How long have you had Finn?

4 years almost to the day. He says it feels like longer!

Also he opened my eyes to the plight of racing greyhounds once their careers are over which in turn inspired me to volunteer at GRF. He has a gas problem. It's not too bad when we're on our own but he must get a bit excited when we have guests as he's 100 times worse. When I notice them going green I have to put him out the room. It's that bad!

5) What 3 words would you use to describe Finn

Totally, utterly, spoiled!

6) What advice would you give to someone, reading this article, who may be thinking of adopting a greyhound?

Go for it! They really don't ask for much and they give you so much in return.

7) Any funny hound stories?

Loads! Never a dull moment with Finn around! My favourite is the time I took him out for a walk on a nice autumn day. Suddenly serenity was shattered as Finn let out his 'I am dead' greyhound scream of death. I nearly had heart failure and this wee man shot round the corner shouting 'what's wrong, what happened'? 
