In Memory of Lassie (Her Royal Houndess) Queen Lassie 1st April 2004 / 23rd November 2017 Time of Crossing over the Rainbow Bridge 10:25 hours



<u>Lassie</u>

Lassie known by her racing name (Hayfield Lass) was one of nine pup's four boys and five girls born to her parents mum, Harsu Heather and dad Larkhill Jo on the 1st April 2004 in the UK she was no April fool Greyhound though.

Lassie was recorded in ninety three races winning twenty two of them at either Glasgow's Shawfield or Brough Park Newcastle. Lassie's first race was on the 4th October 2005 and her last was on 6th September 2008 before her trainer Pamela Weir retired her due to recurring injuries.

It was late October 2008 when we had contacted Celia and Jimmy to ask if they had a suitable girl to help our Billy. Celia's answer was I have the perfect girl that has just come in her name is Lassie she is black and is four and a half. The Kirkcaldy walk is on the first Sunday of November if you bring Billy along to it you can walk the two together and see how they get on. Well with only a few weeks of being retired Lassie found her forever home with us to complete our pack. Celia always said that Billy would blossom with a companion and she was right. He needed lots of tender loving care and encouragement. We could see Lassie was a strong and positive little Greyhound and her confidence flowing out it would help Billy find his. She was his guardian angel.

Lassie had her fan club where ever she went and was loved by everyone she loved it. She was a little madam at times, though she was a perfect ambassador for the breed. Over time we could see Lassie and Billy's personalities blossoming as they bounced off each other.

We were very proud of Lassie when she became a registered Therapet a scheme run by Canine Concern Scotland. It meant Lassie was able to visit care homes and help the elderly by letting them stroke and pat her. It was evident that she was helping residents with dementia and memory issues as some hardly spoke until Lassie visited and it help trigger memories. It was particularly rewarding seeing Lassie enhancing the lives of everyone around her. Another example of how this wonderful breed can transform from racers to a new life in their retirement.

In March 2015 both Lassie and Billy were in home boarding with Karen's Canines and Mikey Karen's Greyhound in Crossgates, Fife. This was the only time that Lassie was looked after by anyone else after we adopted her. As you can imagine her and Billy both lapped it up and loved sharing Mikey's bed settee.

In May 2016 Lassie's companion Billy went to the bridge and we could see she was struggling without him. The annual dog show was just coming up and we were doing our usual work at it and Celia said at the show she had the perfect boy to help wee Lassie his name being Ace. As we were up in the area for a few days for the dog show we all went to Baltree to let Lassie and Ace have a meet and greet it went well and Lassie had a companion once again and our pack was complete again.

One of Lassie favourite past times was to worship the sun in the garden and warm her paws up on the warm brick work of the house.

Lassie kept relatively healthy although she had S.L.O. (Symmetrical Lupoid Onchodystrophy) where her all her nails broke off at the nail bed and grew back calcified, crooked and clumpy. She also had Pannus is her right eye another auto immune condition like the nails. She then developed a cataract in the same eye a few years later and her sight became poor in that eye. She then developed a scratch on the eye surface of that eye which would not heal even after months of vet care and treatments. In the April 2017 four months after the scratch was diagnosed we were recommended by our vets and the Glasgow vet hospital that the best course of treatment for Lassie would be to remove her right eye. We went ahead with the procedure and it was hard for us and Lassie with postoperative care for ten days till the wound healed and all the swelling went down around her face. It was the right decision as she became happier in herself again and became her bouncy self again and she was still our Lassie and just as beautiful.

Lassie liked nothing better than her food and her walks with us. She loved her car journeys in her (mobile kennel) to visit friends and explore new places and new smells and to reply to them (Pee on). She loved going on holiday and visiting family down south. Lassie loved going to our static caravan that we called her second luxury kennel she just wanted to go where we were going. Lassie was a good weather dog that would just about run backwards if it was raining and did not want to go out, She would walk round or jump over the puddles in her way.

Lassie took unwell with what appeared to be an irritable cough and was treated by our vet Boyce and Houston. Over the period of a just a few days Lassie deteriorated and her breathing got heavier and more laboured the vet was not happy and was going to do a chest x-ray her chest. On Thursday 23rd November 2017 Lassie was to get her chest x-ray, she was weak now and when we got her to the vets her legs gave way under her and her and her breathing had got worse overnight. The vet got her through the back of the surgery and on to oxygen therapy but sadly this did not give Lassie any relief. We discussed with the vet Lassie's immediate condition which was grave and we jointly decided that it would be kinder to let our Lassie go with the dignity that she deserved. She had the will to survive but this was not enough and sadly this was her last race as she went over the bridge at 10:25 on the Thursday morning 23rd November 2017. Lassie was thirteen years and eight months old which was a good age for a wee Greyhound.

Lassie loved her nine years of retirement with us after her racing career ended in her new human, hound pack.
