Cole's Holiday





Kev's Corner



Happy Birthday to Sue!



Doggy Doos

Two ingredient dog treat recipe

Ingredients

2 cups of organic wheat flour or rolled oats (or a mix)

200 - 250g of baby food (this can vary depending on what baby food you use) - we used a banana one

(Ensure all ingredients in the baby food are safe for dogs (ie. no onions) and is ideally organic with no preservatives added)



Directions

- 1 Preheat oven to 180°C
- 2 Mix together to form a stiff dough. If necessary, add extra flour or water as needed.
- 3 On a lightly floured surface, roll out dough to between 0.5 to 1cm thick. Use cookie cutters to cut into desired shape or a pizza cutter to make cubes.
- 4 Line a baking tray with baking paper, place treats about 1cm apart. Bake for 20 25 minutes. Allow to cool completely before storing in a paper bag (storing in an air-tight container will make them soft, but they're still edible).

If you are feeling more creative you could add small quantities of their other favourite foods into the mix like (dog safe) peanut butter, grated carrots or a bit of parsley (can help with bad breath).
